The undersigned hereby makes, constitutes and appoints each of Nicole Daniel, Phillip Worley and Gregory Grissom, or any of them acting singly, and with full power of substitution, re-substitution and delegation, the undersigned's true and lawful attorney-in-fact (each of such persons and their substitutes and delegees being referred to herein as the "Attorney-in-Fact"), with full power to act for the undersigned and in the undersigned's name, place and stead, in the undersigned's capacity as an officer, director or stockholder of Louisiana-Pacific Corporation, a Delaware corporation (the "Company"), to:

1.
